not to be used with

Cats: due to their highly sensitive metabolic systems. **Fish and Reptiles**: due to their pH levels and aquatic environment.

Birds: due to their respiratory and metabolic systems. Rodents & small mammals (gerbils, hamsters, rabbits, rats, etc.): there is not enough research on the use of Essential Oils with these animals to determine a safe use.

product summary

Unfortunately, trauma frequently happens to animals... from pets to farm animals to animals in the wild. Severe trauma may be experienced through accidents, extensive surgery, life-threatening attack from another animal or human, or some other distressing event. Physical trauma is always accompanied by emotional and energy field trauma.

This blend can help an animal let go of fear it's holding, feel more grounded, and able to move beyond a traumatic event to experience life again. This very physically relaxing blend can help restore peace and allow the body-mind to accept healing.

suggested use

- Add 6-12 drops undiluted oil blend to 1 ounce all natural shampoo and bathe the animal using caution not to get it into the eyes or ears.
- Place 1-2 drops undiluted blend on a cotton ball or small cloth and attached out of reach on the outside of cage or kennel if your animal must be confined. Diffuse 10-15 minutes at 4-6 hour intervals as needed, not to exceed 3-5 days. If longer term usage is necessary, switch to misting.
- Can be massaged over the Heart and Brachial Chakras, following the dosage chart, to provide comfort. It is especially helpful to hold your pet close if they are small enough and their physical condition allows. Left untreated, PTSD in animals makes for a very fearful, frequently angry, and always unhappy animal that can sometimes become a danger to themselves and others.
- Add 5-6 drops of the undiluted blend to 2 ounces of distilled water in a cobalt blue glass or PET plastic spray bottle. Mist around the animal or spray into the environment to create a loving environment and life the spirits. Very helpful for veterinary offices and rescue centers. Shake before use. Do not spray into eyes or mouth.

massage dosage guidelines (dogs)

Babies & Elderly: 1 drop in 10ml carrier (3 drops per 1 oz) Miniature (Up to 10 lbs): 2 drops in 10ml carrier (6 drops per 1 oz) Small (11-25 lbs): 4 drops in 10ml carrier (12 drops per 1 oz) Medium (26-40 lbs): 6 drops in 10ml carrier (18 drops per 1 oz) Large (41-70 lbs): 8 drops in 10ml carrier (24 drops per 1 oz) Extra-Large (70+ lbs): 10 drops in 10ml carrier (30 drops per 1 oz)

Horses and Large Animals: Follow instructions for medium to extra-large dogs, beginning with less and working up to the larger sizes as you gauge the animal's response and tolerance.

Smaller Animals (Miniature horses, cows, goats, sheep, etc.): Follow instructions for small to large dogs, beginning with less and working up to the larger sizes as you gauge the animal's response and tolerance.
